


Try your best to enter by the narrow door...

In this Sunday's Gospel passage (Luke 13:22-30), Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem to complete His mission: to die for us, to open the door of heaven for us. He is asked whether only a few will be saved. He does not give a direct answer but goes on to speak about the personal effort that is demanded from those who wish to enter the kingdom. 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed". What does Jesus mean by this expression? He is the door. He speaks of



In the passage He points out that merely hearing His message or being in His company does not guarantee salvation. What is needed is a personal commitment – a commitment to grow in friendship with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and in authentic love of our brothers and sisters in Christ. The grace that comes from that commitment, in the normal course of daily life, comes through the celebration of the sacraments, prayers, and the works of love.

"This sacred anointing of the sick was instituted by Christ our Lord as a true and proper sacrament of the New Testament. It is alluded to indeed by Mark, but is

recommended to the faithful and promulgated by James the apostle and brother of the Lord" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, para. 1511; Mark 6:13; Jas. 5:14-15).

The anointing of the sick conveys several graces and imparts gifts of strengthening in the Holy Spirit against anxiety, discouragement, and temptation, and conveys peace and fortitude (CCC 1520). These graces flow from the atoning death of Jesus Christ, for "this was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah, 'He took our infirmities and bore our diseases'" (Matt. 8:17).

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

24 August: St Bartholomew, Apostle. One of the original twelve Apostles. We know of him mainly from the Gospels (Mt 10:3; Mk 3:18; Lk 6:14′ Acts 1;13, John 1:43-52;21:2). Because of this pairing with St Phillip in the three Synoptic Gospels, and because St Philip is paired with St Nathaniel in John's Gospel, many took it that Bartholomew and Nathaniel may be one and the same person. Eusebius's 4th century writing, based upon information of the 2nd century, mentioned that Bartholomew may have possibly paired up with the Apostle St Thomas on his trip to India.

27 August: St Monica, 331-387. Mother. With many tears she prayed for the conversion of her initially wayward son, St Augustine (*feast day suppressed this year as it falls on Sunday 28th*) who eventually became one of the great saints, and one of the greatest Doctors of the Church. In St Augustine's meditations (*Confessions*) on his spiritual journey, he wrote that he wept bitterly for his mother because she wept so many tears for his salvation.
