The Son of Man came to seek and to save what is lost

The Gospel passage (Luke 19:1-10) for this Sunday's Mass centres on Zacchaeus, a tax collector who lived in the time of Jesus. In those days a tax collector like Zacchaeus would be despised by his own people for many reasons. Firstly, he worked for the Romans, the 'occupying power', collecting taxes for the 'enemy'. Secondly, a tax collector would be exacting more money from the people, simply to line his own pockets. Thus, a tax collector like Zacchaeus was



viewed as one of the greatest sinners around. We see them quoted together with sinners in the New Testament (e.g. 'He ate with sinners and tax collectors').

The encounter with Jesus challenged Zacchaeus to review his life even though in the episode, there was no mention of Jesus pointing out his shortcomings. An encounter with someone who is good/holy can often open our eyes to our shortfalls in life and inspire us to change our ways, and be a better person. This happened with Zacchaeus when He encountered Our Lord and we see him promising to correct the wrong he did.

As we come before Christ in the Eucharist may our eyes also be opened to how we can have our own change of heart in the wrong path we have chosen at times. The path to holiness necessarily include occasions of repentance and a change of heart

ALL SOULS AND ALL SAINTS

The solemnity of All Saints, and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (All Souls) fall on the 1st and 2nd of November. They express beautifully there states of the Church: Those of us still living (the **Church Militant**) unite our hearts with, and in a special way remember, the faithful departed, whether they be in heaven (**Church Triumphant**) or in purgatory (**Church Suffering**).

Trivia: Did you know that the mind of the Church is that the Priests do not celebrate more than one Mass a day, except if Pastoral necessity requires it? (Fr Michael has 3/4 for the weekend because of Pastoral need!)? However, for ALL SOULS, priests are authorized to say three Masses even when there is no Pastoral necessity!

Plea from Fr M: Please, do not encourage the celebration of Halloween amongst our youth if its not part of your heritage. It may lead to warp ideas of the dead and loss of our tradition to pray for them.
