

But I say this to you....

St Matthew wrote his Gospel addressing Jewish converts who had come to recognised Jesus as the Messiah they had been waiting for...but, not as they expected. He was not just another human prophet; He is both Divine and human!.

The first **five** books of the Old Testament, namely the books of *Genesis*, *Exodus*, *Leviticus*, *Numbers and Deuteronomy*, are collectively known as the Torah. St Matthew structured his Gospel in a manner very similar to the Torah. It is because the Jewish converts were very familiar with the Torah, and he wanted them to see how in the person of Jesus the Old Testament prophecies were all fulfilled, and



that He was the long awaited Messiah. Knowing this, give us a better sense of the opening remarks by Our Lord in this Sunday's Gospel passage: "I came not to abolish the law and the prophets, but to fulfill them." He went on to say: "You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: but I say this to you....". His words, His teachings, overrode the old Law!. Who can 'override' God's law but God Himself! Laws can be something so 'cold' and heartless. Jesus taught that merely trying to keep the precepts of the ancient Law was not enough. Observing them must be something from the heart. Our external actions must be a reflection of what we really are like inwardly. For example, it is not enough for others to see us performing the actions of a Christian - our whole attitude in life must be Christian. It is not enough to be seen to be upright, we must be upright of heart too.

Saints of the Week

14 February: **Saints Cyril** (827?-869), **monk, and Methodius** (826?-885AD), **Bishop** The saints were blood brothers. Cyril and Methodius believed in the importance of celebrating liturgy in our own language. They translated the liturgical texts into the Slavonic language and invented the Glagolithic and possibly also the Cyrillic alphabet.
