

And they recognised Him at the Breaking of Bread....

The disciples recognised Jesus through his word and in the "breaking of bread". The latter expression, the 'breaking of bread' or 'fractionis panis' is a term used in the Church to refer to the Eucharist. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains:

"The Breaking of Bread, because Jesus used this rite, part of a Jewish meal when as master of the table he blessed and distributed the bread, above all at the Last Supper. It is by this action that his disciples will recognize him after his Resurrection, and it is this expression that the first Christians will use to designate their Eucharistic assemblies; by doing so they signified that all who eat the one broken bread, Christ, enter into communion with him and form but one body in him. (Paragraph 1329. CCC).



In the liturgy of the Mass Christ makes Himself known through His word of Scripture and in the breaking of bread. The Eucharist is a celebration of Easter because not only is it a memorial of Jesus' offering of Himself to the Father but it is also a sign in which we recognise Christ as alive giving Himself to the whole of humanity.

Alleluia He is Risen!

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

St Mark the Evangelist: 26th April: He was a cousin of Barnabas and accompanied the apostle Paul on his first missionary journey; later he followed him to Rome. He was a disciple of Peter. He is credited with founding the Church in Alexandria. His body was stolen from Alexandria in 828 and taken to Venice, which adopted him as its patron saint. The Symbol os St Mark's is that of a winged Lion (and can be seen everywhere in Venice)



- St Peter Chanel, Priest, Martyr (1803-1841AD): 28 April: He was born in France, at Cuet in 1803. He had been a priest for three years when he was accepted by the Marists, a missionary order. He was sent out to evangelize the island of Futuna in the Pacific, where cannibalism had only recently been banned by the local ruler, Niuliki. At first all went well, but as he learned the local language and gained the confidence of the people, Niuliki became jealous and fearful; and the baptism of his son and his son's friends was the last straw. Niuliki sent men who set upon him and clubbed him to death. He is the first martyr of Oceania. Pope Pius XII declared him a saint in 1954
- St Catherine of Siena, Virgin, (1347-1380AD) Doctor of the Church: 29 April: St Catherine was born in Siena and, seeking perfection, entered the Third Order of the Dominicans when she was still in her teens. She wrote letters to many major public figures and carried on a long correspondence with Pope Gregory XI, urging him to reform the clergy and the administration of the Papal States. She fought hard to defend the liberty and rights of the Popes and did much for the renewal of religious life. She also dictated books full of sound doctrine and spiritual inspiration. In 1970 Pope Paul VI declared her a Doctor of the Church.
