#### A sower went out to sow....

The farmer or anyone who sows seeds in the hope of a harvest, lives in a world of chance. The seed may not germinate, or the crop could fail. One would think that any farmer or sower worth his salt, or knows his business, would know how and where to sow his seeds. Yet, in the parable that Our Lord told, he described what appeared someone who was careless, or even wasteful, in his sowing. On top of that, there were forces beyond his control, like the weather, that were against him.



The parable spells it out in vivid detail how each

sowing fared. Three out of four sowings were wasted; only a part of the seed landed on good soil, and produced crop a plenty, and according to our Lord, 100, 60 or 30 fold – which is more than one can normally expect from any harvest! In His elaboration, He of course spoke of the seed that is the Word of God that is being sowed.

There's a second message for us who have "ears to hear" this parable. The ending of the passage sums it up for us: "And the one who received the seed in rich soil is the man who hears the word and understands it; he is the one who yields a harvest and produces now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty."

Are we the "rich soil" Jesus hoped us to be? If we are not at this moment, we can rectify that, by working on the soil: by working on our listening and understanding, that our hearts may be good soil for the Word of God to grow and produce a rich harvest. That is why I have always preached the words which St Augustine used: "Faith seeks understanding...". It is seeking the understanding that we can help the Word to take root in us.....



# SAINT OF THE WEEK

**Saturday 22 July - St Mary Magdalen:** In Biblical accounts, she was healed of "seven devils", and ministered to Our Lord in Galilee and was present at the Crucifixion. Saw was also in the group of women who were the first to discover the empty tomb, and it was to her that Our Lord first appeared after the Resurrection. Although there is no concrete evidence, in Western tradition, Mary Magdalene is often identified with 'the woman who was a sinner", and the sister of Martha and Lazarus of Bethany.
