

# MASS WITH SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK is being offered on Thursday 27th July @ 10.00am at Amberley

(followed by Morning tea in the Hall)
"This sacred anointing of the sick was instituted by

Christ our Lord as a true and proper sacrament of the New Testament. It is alluded to indeed by Mark, but is recommended to the faithful and promulgated by James the apostle and brother of the Lord" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, para. 1511; Mark 6:13; Jas. 5:14-15). The anointing of the sick conveys several graces and imparts gifts of strengthening in the Holy Spirit against anxiety, discouragement, and temptation, and conveys peace and fortitude (CCC 1520). These graces flow from the atoning death of Jesus Christ, for "this was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah, 'He took our infirmities and bore our diseases'" (Matt. 8:17). #### SAINTS OF THE WEEK

**Tuesday 25 July - Feast of St James, Apostles ??-44AD.** He was the brother of St John and both were fishermen. He witnessed the Transfiguration and one of those who slept through Our Lord's agony in the Garden. He was beheaded by King Herod Agrippa I to please the Jewish opponents of Christianity, and was buried in Jerusalem. Eventually his relics were taken to Spain and his shrine at Compostella grew in importance until it became the greatest pilgrimage centre in western Europe.

**Wednesday 26 July - Sts Joachim and Anna, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** An ancient tradition, already known in the 2nd century, gives these names to the parents of the Virgin Mary.
