Come to me all you who labour and are overburdened....

In this Sunday's Gospel passage, Our Lord invites us to come to him with our burdens and heavy loads.

In an imperfect world tarnished by sin – life itself can be burdensome and distressing. In fact, suffering in this life is one of the four "Noble Truths" on which Siddharta Gautama, or Buddha, built his religion some 2500 years ago (more on this in my Sunday Homily!). Two Sundays ago, I have also, more or less, touched on suffering (or distress) when I preached about the prayer the priest prays after the Lord's



Prayer during Mass (which includes a request 'to be safe from all distress').

Burden and distress are part of suffering and they can come from within or from others. The first reading for this Sunday gives us an account of the burden of those who live in a time after the exile of the People of God, whose relief would only come not by the pride of the one on the chariot but by the meekness of the one on a colt (hint: Palm Sunday!). St. Paul in the second reading speaks of another burden, the burden of the flesh. It is the burden of having to deal with our natural inclinations and the stubbornness of human will. Submitting to the Spirit of God is a way of dealing with our natural inclinations.

In whatever from we are labour and are overburdened, Our Lord invites us to come to Him in humility and to learn from him.
