Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar - and to God what belongs to God.'

In this Sunday's Gospel (Matthew: 22:15-21) Our Lord is asked a question that appeared to put Him in a "no win" situation. The Pharisees, in trying to trap Him, asked; "Is it permissible to pay taxed to Caesar or not?" A simple "yes" would put Him in bad light with the Jews, and a simple "No" would have opened Him to be reported as defying the Roman Emperor. His response was classic. Using a coin minted by the Romans, He said: "Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God, what belongs to God. His answer distinguishes two spheres; each is legitimate. If the Jews have accepted the rule of Caesar (as they have accepted his coinage), they must be



prepared to pay taxes to him - but ultimately all dues must be paid to God, for even Caesar has his authority from God.

Our Lord affirms the propriety of fulfilling civil duties while emphasizing our primary duty of serving God. It is good to be reminded of this, and to have both in the right perspective.

ATTENTION!! CULVERDEN MASSES - OCTOBER 2023

Please note that the Mass in Culverden is the "**Vigil of the 1st, 3rd and 5th SUNDAYS** of the month'. It may be confusing if one counts the 'Saturdays of the month' rather than the 'Sundays of the month'. This is problematic only when the First Sunday of the month falls on the first day of the month (e.g. 1 October = Sunday), thus making the Saturdays of the month not being in synch with the Sundays of the month (e.g., Vigil of 1st Sunday in **October** is the Saturday in **September!**). To avoid confusion for October; here are the Mass times:

5th Sun Oct Saturday Vigil in Culverden (28 October)


to share. The hall will be open earlier for you to place the food.
