Love the Lord your God,..... and your neighbour as yourself. In this Sunday Gospel (Matthew 22:34-40), Our Lord made it clear, that all of Sacred Scriptures 'hang on' the two commandments of;

- Loving the Lord, our God, with all our heart, with all our soul, and with all our might'; and
- Loving your neighbour as yourself.'

He insisted that true love of God must be enfleshed in the love of our neighbour. I could even argue that the current war in the middle-east has elements of the disconnection from either one or both of the commandments. When there is no love of neighbour, people end up using violence in the name of God. When there is no love of God, eventually love is confined only to those we like or 'our own', and others are dispensable, or are turned to mere objects. Only in Christianity are these two spelt out strongly: after all, the God who came to us, came as a neighbour and a brother to us. In chapter 25 of Matthew's Gospel, Our Lord Jesus gives us a practical application of these two commandments; i.e., that we should even see God in our neighbour: "…inasmuch as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me".

The two great commandments may be strongly emphasized by Our Lord, but we Christians are still humans who are broken by sin – thus we need to really examine ourselves constantly against the two Commandments.

THE SOLEMNITIES OF ALL SOULS AND ALL SAINTS fall on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of November. They express beautifully the three states of the Church: Those of us still living (the **Church Militant**) uniting our hearts with, and in a special way remember, the faithful departed, whether they be in heaven (**Church Triumphant**) or in purgatory (**Church Suffering**). It is also a very Catholic idea, that *it is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins*".

This year, on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November for All Souls Fr Michael will bless the graves and say a prayer at Balcairn cemetery at 9am and on the way home at the parish's Brackenfield cemetery. Next year Fr Michael may explore doing it in other cemeteries in the parish.

#### **CULVERDEN MASSES - OCTOBER 2023 ATTENTION!!**

Please note that the Mass in Culverden is the "Vigil of the 1st, 3rd and 5th SUNDAYS of the month'. It may be confusing if one counts the 'Saturdays of the month' rather than the 'Sundays of the month'. This is problematic only when the First Sunday of the month falls on the first day of the month (e.g. 1 October = Sunday), thus making the Saturdays of (e.g., Vigil of 1st Sunday in October is the Saturday in the month not being in synch with the Sundays of the month **September!**). To avoid confusion for October; here are the Mass times:

Saturday Vigil (30th September)

2nd Sun Oct No Mass in Culverden √7 October **√14 Octob** 

4th Sun Oct No Mass in Calverden (21 October)

5th Sun Oct Saturday Vigil in Culverden (28 October)

## MASS FOR ALL SOULS In the month of November.

A Box will be placed for you to inscribe and place the names of your dearly departed will be placed in three churches, Hanmer Springs, Culverden & Amberley. Masses will be offered for them for the happy repose of their souls. If you want specific Mass intentions to be offered, please give it to Fr Michael directly and not placed in the box. Plea from Fr M: Please, do not encourage the celebration of Halloween amongst our youth. It may lead to warp ideas of the dead and loss of our tradition to pray for them.

WAR IN GAZA - A humanitarian crisis is looming in the Middle East. Between 8 to 23 October, 5,791 people have lost their lives in Gaza. 7,000 patients and wounded in hospitals are at risk of dying due to lack of supplies.
