Wise Men came came to Jerusalem....

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany. The dictionary gives us two explanations of the word "Epiphany";

- 1) the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matthew 2:1–12)
- 2) a moment of sudden and great revelation or realization

The feast of Christmas that we just celebrated, in a way, is a celebration of the manifestation of Jesus as the Messiah or Saviour of the people of Israel. The Feast of the Epiphany celebrates a much more important manifestation, that Christ is revealed as the Son of God and Saviour of the whole world, and for all people. The adoration of Jesus by the magi, (a.k.a. the 'wise men'), who, according to Saint Matthew, came from countries in the east, is symbolic of the revelation to the rest of the world. Until Christmas was 'commercialised', the Epiphany was, in some countries, a bigger celebration. After all, the epiphany reminds us that all of humanity is meant to know Jesus, that He came to gather all nations, all peoples. He came for everyone.

May Jesus, the light of the world, illumine all humanity and lead everyone, as was the Magi, to Himself. Wise men still seek Him.
