In God's own terms and time

In today's Gospel (Mk. 4, 26-34), Jesus teaches us in the Parable of the Seeds that God acts in His own terms, and in His own time. God's ways are not man's ways. God cannot be dictated to by anything or by anyone. Yes, God is in perfect control. Let God be God, and let man be man.

The Kingdom of God has a life of its own, but that is not to say that we just leave it as such. Yes, grace is operative, whether we know it or not, but our Christian calling is to cooperate with God's grace. We are called to become partners in the Kingdom of God.

Obedience, trust, and patience. These are the three basic attitudes we should have if we are to become co-operators of grace. Those who disobey, those who distrust, and those who are impatient do more harm than good in this partnership with the Divine. May we not become obstacles to the growth of God's Kingdom in our midst. As long as we listen to God in prayer and follow His instructions, we will not become proud with our progress, or be discouraged with our setbacks and failures.

To make sure that we are in tune with God's own terms and with God's time, let us keep in mind that the work of salvation is principally God's work. No one is indispensable. We are just instruments, unworthy ones at that. Let us also learn to work as a team. We don't need superstars. Let us also learn to be patient. There are no shortcuts. Let us not sacrifice quality in the name of efficiency.

Today's Gospel gives us the hope that a small, insignificant seed can grow and become a tree, bearing fruits in time. Let us not be dismayed with our simple and humble beginnings or give in to hopelessness when we encounter delays or setbacks of any kind. As the song says: "God will make a way when it seems there is no way." And yet another song says: "God will make all things beautiful in His time."

Lord, remind me that everything happens in Your own terms, and in Your own time. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE ROSARY

If the rosary is a relationship between us and God, we start meditating on the mysteries of the rosary by acknowledging the fact that we believe in that loving relationship of trust and dependence on God by professing: "I believe in God...".

In each of the mysteries of the rosary, Jesus always leads us to the Father. Jesus wants us to share in his intimate relation with the Father. So as brothers and sisters of Jesus, recognizing one Father in heaven, we say: "Our Father who art in heaven...".

The ten "Hail Marys" is our acknowledgment of Mary's privileged relationship with Christ. As we meditate on this prayer, we entrust our whole life to her maternal intercession as well as the hour of our death.

At the end of each decade, we give praise, worship and thanksgiving to the Trinity. So we exclaim: "Glory be to the Father...".

The concluding prayer is an invocation to Jesus to forgive us, to spare us from hell and to lead all souls to heaven according to His mercy.
