### **Pointers**

In today's Gospel (Jn. 6, 24-35) we hear about a crowd that came looking for Jesus. To see more signs? No. To get more bread, after they experienced the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves. Let us ask ourselves today: What am I really looking for in life? Am I focused on the perishable and have forgotten the eternal?

Jesus' whole life was a constant pointing to eternal life. He told us to look beyond this world and to set our sight not only on familiar shores but also on the distant shores that await us. Let us ask ourselves today: Have I set my sight too near, looking only for that which is comfortable and quantifiable?

What is a pointer? A pointer is one who makes a point. A pointer is one who makes a point precisely because he/she points to something or Someone greater than himself/herself. Jesus, by His life and death, pointed to the Father and the hereafter. The people who point at themselves usually end up living pointless lives. Sooner or later, they end up imprisoned by their own greed and unbridled desires.

Jesus reminds us today to look beyond the temporary and the perishable. As we go about our daily lives, may we not lose sight of the "big picture" of who we are, and what we are meant to be. Let us not forget that many important things cannot be measured, quantified, by worldly measures and standards.

At the end of our lives, may we have no or little regrets that we loved too little too late. May we not have hands filled with perishables, and consumables, and not have hearts empty of those that are worthy and honourable.

Lord, help me not to live a pointless life. Amen.

## (See Baltimore Catechism)

## Q. 374. What should we do after Holy Communion?

A. After Holy Communion we should spend some time adoring Our Lord, thanking Him, renewing our promises of love and of obedience to Him, and asking Him for blessings for ourselves and others.

## Q. 375. What are the chief effects of a worthy Holy Communion?

- A. The chief effects of a worthy Holy Communion are:
- 1. first, a closer union with Our Lord and a more fervent love of God and of our neighbour;
- 2. second, an increase of sanctifying grace;
- 3. third, preservation from mortal sin and the remission of venial sin;
- 4. Fourth, the lessening of our inclinations to sin and the help to practice good works.

# Q. 378. How should we show our gratitude to Our Lord for remaining always on our altars in the Holy Eucharist?

**A.** We should show our gratitude to Our Lord for remaining always on our altars in the Holy Eucharist, by visiting Him often, by reverence in church, by assisting every day at Mass when this is possible, by attending parish devotions, and by being present at Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.
