Sail on... Anchor!

The story is told about a priest who asked the sailor penitent when was the last time he went to confession: "Ten years ago?" The sailor answered: "Sail on, Father." "Twenty years ago?" the priest asked again. "Sail on, Father!" "Thirty years ago?" he asked the third time. The sailor said: "Anchor, Father!" After confession, the sailor asked the priest: "If I did not make this confession, would I go to heaven?" The priest said: "Sail on, son." "To purgatory, then?" "Sail on, son." Finally, he exclaimed: "To hell, Father?" "Anchor, son!"

In today's Gospel (Mk. 9, 38-43.45. 47-48) Jesus stresses the need for radical conversion: "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off." In other words, we must put a stop to sin (anchor!), and not just keep sailing on. All too often, we put off and postpone our conversion. Conversion is here. Conversion is now.

"Cut clean, and cut now." This is a very good advice for all of us. What are those things, people, thoughts, values and desires that imprison us? May the Lord cut us loose and set us free from sin, and make our hearts light again.

"I wish I sinned less, and loved more." I can relate with this wish. In a way I am glad that I have realised this now, and not at the very end of my life when this wish will just have been a one big heavy regret. Let this wish then be for all of us a challenge and a decision to sin less and love more, from now on.

There are two moments of conversion: Stop sinning, and, start loving. It is not enough to stop sinning. One must also start loving in reparation for one's sins, and in gratitude for God's mercy and forgiveness. It is not enough to say "I'm already clean." This must flow into the other moment that says "I'm already loving." In other words, freedom from sin should lead to freedom for loving.

If you are reading this column right now, and you honestly feel in your heart and mind that there's no way you can be freed of your sinful desires or of your sinful situation, just pause and sincerely pray right now: "Lord, I need you. Come into my life. Set me free from sin by the power of the Holy Spirit. Lord, forgive me. Lord help me. Lord, have mercy on me. Amen."

God's love is greater than all our sins. God's mercy is broader and deeper than we can imagine. Yes, we are loved by God more than we know or realise and more than we allow ourselves. And remember, it is better to be presumptuous of God's love than to doubt God's love.

Lord, help me to listen and to obey You when to anchor, and when to sail on. Amen.

LIGHT OF FAITH

Baltimore Catechism

Q. 175. What is meant in the Apostles' Creed by "the forgiveness of sins?"

A. By "the forgiveness of sins" in the Apostles' Creed is meant that God has given to the Church, through Jesus Christ, the power to forgive sins, no matter how great or how many they are, if sinners truly repent.

The Church exercises the power to forgive sin when sins committed before the reception of Baptism are forgiven by that sacrament; but especially does the Church exercise this power in the sacrament of Penance.

"He therefore said to them again, 'Peace be to you! As the Father has sent me, I also send you.' When he had said this, he breathed upon them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit; whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them; and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained' " (John 20:21-23).
