## **Hands and Fingers**

In today's Gospel (Jn. 8, 1-11), fingers do a lot of talking. On one hand are the accusing fingers of the Scribes and the Pharisees pointed toward the woman caught in adultery; and on the other is the exonerating finger of Jesus writing on the ground.

Take a look at your hands. Do you have accusing, condemning fingers?

Do you have dirty hands that grab, steal, hurt and often turn into a clenched fist in anger?

Or, do you have welcoming, pardoning and approving fingers?

Do you have clean hands that share, reach out, console and often are folded before God in prayer?

Your fingers and hands say a lot. Are you listening?

Some people spend their whole lifetime pointing at themselves, only to realise in the end how empty and vain the whole exercise was. As we go through life, may we point at something or someone greater than us. And some people spend their whole lifetime grabbing and hoarding earthly wealth and honours, only to realise in the end how futile and burdensome it all was. May we go through life with open hands that gratefully receive and generously share and give.

We don't know what Jesus wrote on the ground, but the picture of Jesus pointing to the ground was in itself very symbolic. It was Jesus' way of reminding the proud, the arrogant and the self-righteous of their mortality. Lent is that special time of the year we are reminded that we are dust, and to dust we will return. Think about it: The personal concerns and agenda you have right now won't matter five minutes after you're gone.

Lord, give me hands and fingers that truly care and share. Amen.

## LIGHT of FAITH - Confession Explained

#### Why is Sacramental Confession necessary for Catholics?

Catholics believe that Confession is necessary for the forgiveness of post-baptismal sins because Christ instituted the Sacrament of Penance for this purpose (John 20:22-23). Church Canon Law states: "All the faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at lease once a year." (CIC, 989). Catholics who confess their sins have the assurance of Christ Himself that their sins are forgiven (Matt 18:18; John 20:23).

### How often should one go to Sacramental Confession?

The second precept (or law) of the Catholic Church states: "You shall confess your sins at least once a year. This ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness" (2042). As a matter of devotion, monthly Confession or Seasonal Confession (Christmas, Easter, Pentecost) is recommended. Children and RCIA Candidates are to go to Confession prior to their receiving First Holy Communion. (CIC, 914), (RCIA, 482). Pastoral Counsel: "If you commit a mortal sin, go to Confession as soon as you can and certainly before your next Holy Communion. For spiritual growth, go to Confession regularly or seasonally."
